Thought for the month

Sabbath and festivals

We read in Genesis, 'And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation' (Genesis 2:2-3).

Why did God rest? Was he tired? No – the Sabbath is described as 'holy and hallowed' and set aside by God, the rabbis of old tell us, so that time could be spent enjoying Creation which was so lovingly made.

In June we will be offered time to enjoy Creation at our four churches' Flower Festivals and the Harvington Festival, with the opportunity to visit our neighbours' gardens. This time of year is one of my highlights as I observe nature bursting with colour and growth and the air filled with birdsong: an opportunity to recognise and revel in Creation's glory as God did on the Sabbath.

I appreciate nature best while walking or running but it's also a time to think and notice where nature is not being hallowed. Litter in the verge, the cars speeding by, and the silent, tree-free, hedge-light fields. It makes me reflect on how much I am participating in the desecration of Creation which God so lovingly made – and what I can do to protect it.

In the autumn we are inviting Chris Haynes, a local environmentalist, to tell us ways that we might consider adopting to change how we live our daily lives. We need to change so that future generations can have Sabbaths similar to ours, filled with colour, delight and birdsong.

Is it sport? Or faith?

A former Liverpool manager Bill Shankly famously said, 'Some people believe football is a matter of life and death. I am very disappointed with that attitude. I can assure you it is much, much more important than that!'

This month sees the start of the UEFA Euro 2024 football tournament which will be watched by millions across Europe and the world. Yet it also illustrates some key points about the Christian life. As Paul writes, 'But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus' (Philippians 3:13b-14).

A prize to be won: The dream of every player in the competition is to be able to hold up the cup themselves. For us the prize is the eternal life, God's gift of relationship with Him for now and eternity through Jesus. But there's an important difference between football and the Christian faith. To win the Euros you have to be good enough, whereas Christ's love for us is undeserved and is not dependent on how well we've done.

Training to be undertaken: If a team is going to win Euro 2024, they need to have trained hard beforehand. Our training as Christians starts the moment we accept the gift of God's life. On a daily basis, we must train ourselves to say no to the wrong things in our lives.

As we build up our *godly muscles*, we are better able to choose to do what is right in God's eyes. To enable us to do all this we need to engage in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, studying the Bible and being part of a church and small group. How is your training going?

Definitions

Judges: what's the big idea?

Continuing the series introducing the books of the Old Testament...

Following Joshua's death, a generation grew up who didn't know God (*Judges 2:11*) and 'every man did what was right in his own eyes' (*Judges 17:6, 21:25*). The book of Judges is a study in God's response to a permissive society.

The book takes its name from the *deliverers* that God raised up during this time. God empowered both men and women with His Spirit to rule and deliver the people. They included Ehud, Deborah, Gideon and his son Abimelech, Jephthah and Samson. The judges operated in the 350 years (from 1050BC) between Joshua's death and the monarchy.

We see a recurring cycle of apostasy, oppression, penitence and deliverance played out. When the people fell into sin, God sent an enemy nation to oppress them. As a result, they cried to God for help, and He responded by raising up a deliverer to free them.

The saddest words in Judges are those applied to Samson, 'He did not know that the Lord had left him' (Judges 16:20). Rejecting God in our lives can begin with tolerating those things that are not in harmony with His will for our lives. The people's toleration of the beliefs of their pagan neighbours led to a conformity in life and worship with them. Yet God waited for His people to return to Him, when He responded with grace to deliver them.

Gideon stands out as somebody who was unwilling to compromise with the surrounding culture. Despite his weaknesses, God used him to deliver Israel from the Midianite invaders. We read: 'the Spirit of the Lord came upon Gideon', literally 'the Spirit clothed Himself with Gideon' (Judges 6:34). God's grace and faithfulness is at work in those who are prepared to trust Him.

Musings

Inanimate objects are classified scientifically into three major categories: those that don't work, those that break down and those that get lost. *Russell Baker* I'm taking care of my procrastination issues. Just you wait and see.

Do you struggle with doubt?

Do you ever look at other Christians and wonder, 'Do they REALLY believe this Christian stuff? That Jesus really was the Son of God who rose again and is alive today?'

Doubt is an honest place to be, and it is not the opposite of Christian faith. To believe is to be in one mind. To disbelieve is also to be in one mind. To doubt is to waver between the two minds, to be in a state of 'double-ness' or 'two-ness'. To doubt something is to be willing to believe it – IF you can find evidence to back up the story.

If you are in this state of 'double-ness' just now, you may find the story of the disciple Thomas (*John 20:24-29*) helpful. Unlike the other disciples, he was not present on that first Easter night when Jesus appeared to the other disciples. Instead, Thomas was told that someone whom he'd seen crucified and dead was alive again three days later, and in perfect health!

Thomas had been devoted to Jesus, but the fact that dead people don't rise again made the story just too much for him. So, despite the joy of the other disciples, he could get only as far as 'unless I see the nail marks... I will not believe it.' It was a week later that Jesus appeared again to His disciples and confronted Thomas. He said simply, 'Put your finger here; see my hands... Stop doubting and believe.' Jesus then looked forward to all the millions of people in the future who would never meet Him in person, and so would have understandable grounds to doubt. 'Because you have seen Me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.'

Thomas needed physical recognition before he could say 'My Lord and My God.' Today, if you want to believe but honestly struggle with doubt, consider using this simple prayer:

'Lord Jesus, I have never seen You in person so, I sometimes doubt that you exist. The Bible tells us that it is only the Holy Spirit who can open our "spiritual eyes", and so I ask You to do that for me. Please give me not physical recognition, but faith recognition. I will do my bit, and will read about you each day in the Bible. Through Your Word, please open my spiritual eyes so that I can see You clearly as Jesus, the risen Son of God. Amen.'

On the perils of building a kitchen in church...

Happily, the Church of England still retains some singular parish clergy. Take the parish of St James-the-Least, whose elderly Anglo-Catholic vicar, Eustace, continues his correspondence to his nephew Darren, a recently-ordained low-church curate... My dear Nephew Darren,

It never fails to amaze me how, in church life, an issue can suddenly become an Issue. Recently, we have acquired an Issue: a proposal to convert a space at the back of the church into a kitchen. Inevitably, battle lines have been drawn and trenches dug. Attendance at church council meetings has soared and unofficial sub-committees meet in the car park after Services. It's obvious that feelings are running high because people have become remarkably polite to one another.

Some who are wildly in favour see it as an opportunity to leave the pews ten minutes early in order to get ready for the rush for weak coffee and damp biscuits. I can already hear in my mind the final hymn being drowned by kettles being filled, biscuit tins opened, cups thunderingly placed on saucers while the volunteers discuss the dress sense of others in the congregation in deafening whispers. Naturally, smaller turf wars have broken out alongside the major battle: should we get new crockery, what colour carpet tiles would look right – and most importantly of all, who will take charge of the coffee rota?

I was a little surprised to hear that Colonel Wainwright was all in favour – until I realised it would give him a place to totter into to read his newspaper once he got bored with my sermon, which usually seems to happen in the first minute.

Others are totally against the project: the treasurer dreads the thought of signing yet more cheques, the churchwardens worry about removing pews which have quietly hidden the dry rot, and the theologically angst-ridden agonise about the fact that St Paul never mentioned coffee after Sabbath worship.

Naturally I encourage all sides, especially if it will bring any possibility of progress to a halt. I proposed bringing in flasks of coffee, thus stopping anyone being able to escape before the end of the Service; I suggested drinks being brought to people in the pews, thus ruining the Colonel's hopes of finding a safe haven.

I am sure by the time all these groups have come up with their conclusions, we will have safely moved on to fight the next Issue.

As part of our work about loss, the children produced a range of work including drawings and poems for a memory book dedicated to Mrs Fishbourne to remember the fantastic work she did throughout the 33 years she worked at our school.

Last half term our core value was *Respect*: the children were thinking about how to show respect to one another.
